WHY WE NEED A BIGGER AND BETTER RETIREMENT VILLAGES UNIT (OFAW): Queries in the last few weeks have painted a discouraging picture of operators not respecting residents' rights, views and needs

- Lack of forethought in planning for fire in a bushfire area. (Not an issue at The Reserve as we are in a Bushfire Safe area).
- Adding small charges for services not rendered to recurrent charge deductions.
- Refusal to answer certain types of questions at a general meeting.
- An abysmal instance of harassment and intimidation against an elderly resident.

The list goes on unfortunately. To help, send a message to the Minister for Human Services, Nat Cook at ministerhumanservices@sa.gov.au and suggest that more staff be employed in the Retirement Villages Unit of the OFAW and that these staff are empowered to really improve the lives of retirement village residents with meaningful oversight and enforcement of the RV legislation and regulations.


CHRISTMAS BASKETS RAFFLE
