From the Residents' Committee:

Under the Rules of our Residents' Committee and the Constitution of the Residents' Association we are to hold an Annual General Meeting of residents within 3 months after the end of the financial year.

THE 2025 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING WILL BE ON SEPTEMBER 10th. at 2pm. At these meetings (held consecutively on the same afternoon), your committees are required to provide reports of their activities, present audited financial account documents and elect committee members for the next year. These are distributed prior to the meetings.

In our Village we have the same members on each of the administrative bodies (this is not the same for all Lifestyle Villages) as our Residents' Association conducts barely any business. Each of the Committees consist of Chairperson, Vice Chairperson, Secretary, Treasurer and at least 4 but no more than 6 ordinary committee members (ed: NONE of our current committee members are ORDINARY!!!!) At the AGM, all positions on both committees are declared vacant and any resident can nominate to be elected to the committees. For the meetings to be binding, a quorum must be present—that is 50 members, in person or by proxy (A Proxy vote allows one person to vote on behalf of another when a written & signed authorisation is lodged.) Just to confuse matters, the Constitution of the Association—an incorporated body—allows one vote per each member present (proxy = present) but the Rules of the Committee allow one vote per household. Regardless, it's important to attend or to delegate a proxy to vote on your behalf.

There are several of our current committee who are not renominating so it's your chance to have input into the workings of your village and to help with decisions that benefit all of our residents.

The nomination forms and proxy forms are in the meeting room and can be completed and returned to the letterbox of Unit 47. *Please note:* The person nominating for a position, the proposer and seconder must all come from different Units. Proxy forms are not so involved.

myagedcare

On 21st July more than 50 residents came to hear about My Aged Care. Lauren and Sharon spoke about how to navigate and engage with services for My Aged Care.

They stressed the importance of registering for My Aged Care once someone turns 65, rather than waiting until help is needed. (*Kathy's Note*: I recently did this by phone and it was quite easy. It helps to think about what your needs are before you call. You will need to give your Medicare number.) At the same time, it is important to register a supporter who can speak on your behalf if necessary. This can be a spouse, family member or friend. The supporter needs to give consent.

There are two types of packages at the moment, although this is scheduled to change on 1 November 2025. At the moment, Commonwealth Home Care Support offers short term support, with one or two services

only. An assessment will be needed first. When you have an assessment, do make sure you describe your needs on your worst possible day, rather than your best day.

If your needs are more complex and you need ongoing support, you may be eligible for a Home Care package. This includes help with every day tasks such as showering, transport etc. A financial assessment will be needed as well as an assessment of your needs. From November there will only be one fund to cover both of the above, called Support at Home. If you already have a Home Care package it will be automatically rolled over. A Home Care package may include allied health services such as physiotherapy, equipment and home modifications, and the End of Life Pathway, with extra funding to support older people to stay at home in the last 3 months of life.

If your needs change, do contact My Aged Care to let them know you need more support.

The speakers stressed that it is a complex system and even if you are given codes that would allow you to access support, it doesn't mean that the local agencies have the funding or capacity to provide that support. They said you can call around to ask, but it you can't find the help you need, you should definitely call My Aged Care and let them know.
