On Wednesday 18th August, John Canney & I attended the SARVRA AGM which we felt was most worthwhile & below is a summary of most of the key points:

The Retirement Villages Regulations were proclaimed in the week ending 15 August 2025 and will come into effect on 2nd February 2026, except for the code of conduct.

SARVRA now has a direct phone number 0415311501 and membership fees remain at \$10 per unit.

The new Committee Members are Margaret Tuffin (Chair), Margaret Hawkins (Vice Chair & Treasurer), Cheryle Barry (Secretary), Committee members – Paul Pamment, Quentin McKell, Stephenie Sheppard, Andy Hagan & Ivar Schmidt (from Mt Barker). There are still three vacancies on the Committee. Pam Castle, a former Committee Member, is now active with COTA (see their note below).

Former Chair Roger Adamson (from Golden Grove) was awarded Life Membership for his services to SARVRA – well done mate!

Council on the Ageing (COTA) represent the interests of more than 700,000 South Australians aged 50+. Their CEO Miranda Starke, gave an interesting presentation highlighting the results of a recent survey of +50's concerns as below:

1 Cost of Living; 2 Access to Health Care; 3 Aged Care. 4 Ageism.

She was critical of the recent State budget with the lack of assistance for seniors' issues and gave details of some cases. She also covered instances of Seniors missing meals to cover increases in rent and selling assets to get by.

Current Policies being pursued with the Government include the elimination of Ambulance fees for Senior Citizens (SA is the only state billing Seniors for an ambulance!) and changes to the Patient Assistance Transport Scheme (PATS). Seniors in regions close to Adelaide do not qualify for the scheme.

Seniors are encouraged to become a member of COTA and provide their stories on topics that affect their standard of living.

Rebekha Sharkie MP, Federal Member for Mayo, gave an excellent speech noting her push for Retirement Villages to be classified as a financial product. The aim of this is to give residents in Retirement Villages more protection from actions by some Operators. Residents currently have a right to occupy. She is very interested in hearing from residents with stories to tell and also gave examples of cases advised to her office.

On Wednesday 20th, our effervescent Silver Foxes and ever young Golden Girls held their usual monthly lunches at the Victoria, O'Halloran Hill & the Highway respectively; good reports from both groups – thanks to Pam and Don's deputy for organising!

Next was the External Event trip on Wednesday 27th to The Grange for a visit to the Captain Sturt Museum, followed by lunch at Lockleys Hotel – sounds like they had a great time – please see the full report. Thanks Chris for organising!

Finally for the month was the Catered Lunch on Sunday 31st, where 80 Residents enjoyed a great Quiche & salad lunch followed by Cream Sponge – thanks Denise & the catering group – please see Denise's report.

Kitchen Matters - August 2025

Freezer above Fridge in Dishwasher area

Some time ago a lock was put on the large freezer near the bar. The freezer above the fridge in the dishwasher area is for the use of the Catering Committee. However, if it is not in use, you are able to put food in it, providing you firstly let me know and then label your food with your name and unit number. Should I need to use the freezer for an event, then if your food is not labelled, it may be disposed of!

Large white tubs

Di, our dishwasher lady, has provided these tubs at her own expense to collect the organic waste from food preparation and the waste collected from the plates at the event. These bins frequently disappear, however at today's date they are now back! Please kindly leave these in the dishwasher area and purchase your own bin – only \$5 from Barnacle Bill's.

Catered Event Meal Cancellations

If you are unable to attend the catered event, please phone me by 10.00am on the day of the meal at the latest. This gives me time to amend Joan's sign-in sheet, my sheet showing special requests, the table plan and make labels for the food to go in the fridge or to be taken away at the end of the event. If I am told after this (especially when we are busy plating up food!!!), then the meal is delivered to the table, and someone will need to cover the food in foil and take it to you. The foil will be available on the serving hatch for your use. Please do not expect to find the food in the fridge at the end of the meal if the cancellation is late! Should you call the hall and request a takeaway meal, and we agree we have time to put it in the fridge, then please be advised that those meals in the fridge should not be collected until the event is finished.

Linen Tablecloths

If the white linen tablecloths are used, then they need to be washed and ironed. The ladies laying the tables know this, but it is a large task if 18 tablecloths are used as was the case for the July event. A resident has suggested that if one person on each table took on the task for 2 tablecloths, this would be less onerous for those decorating the tables. 
The Arty Party
